Insignia Communities Give Back

Their latest endeavors include joining the Alzheimer's Association's "Walk to End Alzheimer's", partnering with "Bridges to Recovery" to create food bags for the homeless and hosting a Chili Supper in November to collect blankets to benefit homeless seniors in the Atlanta area.

Tapestry House joined The River Church and "Bridges to Recovery", a local non-profit organization providing ministry to the homeless living under bridges and overpasses in the greater Atlanta area. Together the team created over fifty food bags to distribute to individuals in need. The residents of Tapestry House and volunteers from The River were treated to a special musical performance by The Abbendingos!

The public is invited to join us at Tapestry House or Gardens of Roswell on November 6th to enjoy a special chili supper for the cost of a new blanket or \$10. The proceeds will be used to purchase warm blankets for distribution to needy seniors in the local community.
